Declarations of Interest

This note briefly summarises the position on interests which you must declare at the meeting. Please refer to the Members' Code of Conduct in Part 9.1 of the Constitution for a fuller description.

The duty to declare ...

You must always declare any "personal interest" in a matter under consideration, ie where the matter affects (either positively or negatively):

- (i) any of the financial and other interests which you are required to notify for inclusion in the statutory Register of Members' Interests; or
- (ii) your own well-being or financial position or that of any member of your family or any person with whom you have a close association more than it would affect other people in the County.

Whose interests are included ...

"Member of your family" in (ii) above includes spouses and partners and other relatives' spouses and partners, and extends to the employment and investment interests of relatives and friends and their involvement in other bodies of various descriptions. For a full list of what "relative" covers, please see the Code of Conduct.

When and what to declare ...

The best time to make any declaration is under the agenda item "Declarations of Interest". Under the Code you must declare not later than at the start of the item concerned or (if different) as soon as the interest "becomes apparent".

In making a declaration you must state the nature of the interest.

Taking part if you have an interest ...

Having made a declaration you may still take part in the debate and vote on the matter unless your personal interest is also a "prejudicial" interest.

"Prejudicial" interests ...

A prejudicial interest is one which a member of the public knowing the relevant facts would think so significant as to be likely to affect your judgment of the public interest.

What to do if your interest is prejudicial ...

If you have a prejudicial interest in any matter under consideration, you may remain in the room but only for the purpose of making representations, answering questions or giving evidence relating to the matter under consideration, provided that the public are also allowed to attend the meeting for the same purpose, whether under a statutory right or otherwise.

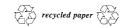
Exceptions ...

There are a few circumstances where you may regard yourself as not having a prejudicial interest or may participate even though you may have one. These, together with other rules about participation in the case of a prejudicial interest, are set out in paragraphs 10 – 12 of the Code.

Seeking Advice ...

It is your responsibility to decide whether any of these provisions apply to you in particular circumstances, but you may wish to seek the advice of the Monitoring Officer before the meeting.

If you have any special requirements (such as a large print version of these papers or special access facilities) please contact the officer named on the front page, but please give as much notice as possible before the meeting.

Gradings Sub-Committee

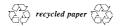
To agree changes to the salaries and remuneration of Directors and other officers on Chief Officer or equivalent grades.

8/10 MINUTES

(Agenda No. 2)

The Minutes of the meeting held on 29 April (DO2) were approved and signed.

9/10 BYELAW REGULATING THE EMPLOYMENT OF CHILDREN UNDER 14 (Agenda No. 5)

The Committee considered a report (DO5) informing members that, following feedback from the National Network for Children in Employment and Entertainment, the former Department for Children, Young People & Families (DCSF) had written to local authorities to draw attention to the fact that byelaws concerning the employment of children under 14 may be out of date in that they permitted children between the ages of 10 and 13 to work in occasional light agricultural work under adult supervision.

The Assistant Head of Legal & Democratic Services outlined the background to the current position. The existing Oxfordshire County Council byelaw which had been approved by Council in July 1998, coming into force on 4 August 1998, required amendment in this respect.

At members' request, Mr. Cloke undertook to provide Committee members with further details regarding the definition of 'light agricultural or horticultural work on an occasional basis'.

RESOLVED: to

- (a) revoke the current Oxfordshire County Council byelaw governing the employment of children under the age of 14 years; and
- (b) make a new byelaw in the same terms save for the changes necessary to reflect the legislation and the guidance from the former DCSF (set out in paragraphs 3 and 4 of the report), following the usual procedure.

10/10 APPOINTMENT OF A DESIGNATED SCRUTINY OFFICER (Agenda No. 6)

This Assistant Head of Legal & Democratic Services reported that the Committee had within its terms of reference the power to appoint officers for particular purposes (appointment of "proper officers") under paragraph 40 of Section I of Schedule 1 to the Local Authorities (Functions and Responsibilities) (England) Regulations 2000, as amended.

The Committee considered the report and whether, in the circumstances, it was appropriate that the Head of Service within whose responsibilities the scrutiny function sat (currently the Head of Strategy) should be designated as the 'scrutiny officer'.

RESOLVED: to designate the Head of Service within whose responsibilities the scrutiny function sat as the 'scrutiny officer' for the purposes of section 31 of the Local Democracy, Economic Development and Construction Act 2009.

11/10 OUTSIDE BODIES APPOINTMENTS
