### **Alteration description**

**4.** A description of the proposed alteration and in the case of special school proposals, a description of the current special needs provision.

Oxfordshire County Council is proposing to increase the capacity of St Christopher's CE Primary School, Cowley from 1.5 forms of entry to 2 forms of entry on a permanent basis from September 2012.

#### **School capacity**

The current capacity of the school is 315 (Reception – Year 6) and the proposed capacity will be 420.

(b) details of the current number of pupils admitted to the school in each relevant age group, and where this number is to change, the proposed number of pupils to be admitted in each relevant age group in the first school year in which the proposals will have been implemented;

Until 2010 the published admission number for the school was 45. By agreement between the county council and St Christopher's governing body, the school admitted over its admission number in 2009 and 2010, accepting up to 60 children. For 2011 entry the school published an admission number of 60. This proposal is to make this level of admissions

permanent.

The gradual growth of the school has led to a rise in indicated admission number over the last few years:

- For admissions up to and including September 2007 the indicated admission number was 40. This affects year groups 3-6 in the May 2011 pupil census. Of these year groups, only Year 5 was below this number in the May 2011 census, with 37 children.
- For admissions in September 2008-2010 the indicated admission number was 45. This affects year groups R-2 in the May 2011 pupil census. Of these year groups, all were above this number in the May 2011 pupil census.
- From September 2011, the indicated admission number is 49. 60 children are expected to be admitted.

At the May 2011 pupil census, the number of pupils (Reception -Year 6) registered at the school was 324. For September 2011 this is expected to rise to around 345

# **Objectives**

**10.** The objectives of the proposals.

This proposal forms part of Oxfordshire County Council's strategy to expand primary school provision within Oxford to meet the needs of the local population.

Oxford city is experiencing rapid growth in pupil numbers, and Primary Care Trust records and the annual census of local children in early years settings show that the demand for places at St Christopher's CE Primary School is likely to continue to be above the planned admission number. Other nearby schools are also expected to be full or nearly full, and expansions are underway or planned for several other schools in the city.

For September 2010, 50 parents chose St Christopher's CE Primary School as their first preference against a published admission number of 45, and to help accommodate the rising numbers of children needing primary school places in Oxford, the school agreed to take more than its admission number (as it had already done in 2009) accepting up to 60 children into the reception class. It also agreed to publish an admission number of 60 for September 2011 entry.

This proposal is to make the increased admission number permanent through an increase in capacity of the school.

#### Consultation

- a) Consultation was carried out with staff, governors and parents at St Christopher's CE Primary School; local early years providers; local residents; local councillors (parish, district and county) and MP; trade unions representing staff at the school; other local primary and secondary schools; CE and RC dioceses; and other interested parties.
- b) No public consultation meeting was held.
- c) Thirteen responses to the consultation were received.
  - Eight respondents supported the proposal (though some with qualifications as noted below).
  - o Three respondents opposed the proposal.
  - Two were neutral.

### Reasons for supporting the proposal included:

- o Expansion will provide school places for local children.
- o Expansion will cater for the increase in population.
- o Expansion will allow the school to teach in single age classes
- o The school site is large enough to support expansion.

#### The following concerns were raised:

- Traffic at the start and finish of the school day (3 respondents).
- o The need for additional accommodation (3 respondents)...
- The school should not be expanded until it has been out of special measures for some time. The priority should be on improving the school's performance (3 respondents).
- The need for additional staffing and other resources (2 respondents).
- That the school should avoid the use of fair banding for admissions (1 respondent).
- d) All applicable statutory requirements to consult have been complied with.
- e) The consultation leaflet is attached as Appendix 1. These were sent via the school to parents. Consultation leaflets were also sent to local primary schools, early years providers, the local secondary schools, local councillors and MPs, and other stakeholders. The leaflet was also available on the county council's website.

### **Project costs**

**12.** A statement of the estimated total capital cost of the proposals and the breakdown of the costs that are to be met by the governing body, the local education authority, and any other party.

A feasibility study is underway to identify the options for providing additional accommodation to address the infrastructure issues related to this expansion.

The estimated cost of providing the additional classroom spaces in permanent buildings is in the region of £1.7m. It is anticipated that capital works will be funded by the local authority; the school will be responsible for furniture and IT equipment.

**13.** A copy of confirmation from the Secretary of State, local education authority and the Learning and Skills Council for England (as the case may be) that funds will be made available (including costs to cover any necessary site purchase).

Oxfordshire County Council capital funding forward plans include funds to assist with demographic issues on school places. Once the preferred solution, costs and phasing options have been identified and agreed, funding will be allocated from within the County Council's Capital Programme 2012/13 onwards. It is anticipated that there will be opportunities to recover some of the costs for the work from future housing developer funding (S.106) agreements.

### Need or demand for additional places

Due to rising numbers across Oxford City, 60 places were allocated to the school for September 2009 and 2010. As a consequence the school's admission number for 2011 was published at 60, using existing permanent accommodation and a temporary classroom installed in 2010. In September 2011 the school has more than 45 children per year from the Reception Year to Year 4 inclusive.

By the application deadline for 2011 entry, the partnership of schools in this part of Oxford had received 358 first preference applications for 325 Reception places; there were also late applications.

In recent years Oxford has experienced a significant and sustained rise in primary pupil numbers. To meet this demand, in 2008 an additional 105 primary school places across the city were agreed; in 2009 a further 245 additional primary school places were created, and in 2010 another 238 additional places were created. Looking to the future, significant additional housing is included in Oxford City Council's Core Strategy, which will, in turn, lead to increased pupil numbers across the city.

The number of places at CE schools does not meet parental demand in Oxford. Within Oxford city there are 484 Reception places available at Church of England (VC or VA) schools (with St Christopher's at 45). For 2010 there were 613 first preference applications for these schools; by the close of applications for 2011 there had been 526 first preference applications, with more expected from late applications.
