Disruption of a County Drugs Line active in Witney. Line holder trafficked an 18yr old female from London to deal, with drugs secreted inside her body. Nico Pascal subsequently received a custodial sentence of $7 \frac{1}{4}$ yrs and the female was safeguarded.



Op Jackknife – disruption of organised crime group responsible for burglary and offending in rural community. Trial to commence Spring 2022.

Joint investigations with Gloucestershire Police to target burglars responsible for offending across Force boundaries

Cherwell LPA

- 37 CDL's & LDL's disrupted in 18 months, a total of 51 years imprisonment so far for perpetrators.
- 10 Closure Orders issued to safe guard vulnerable people.
- 10 POLIT warrants executed targeting those suspected of making, possessing and distributing indecent images.
- 10 Cash Detention Orders seized totalling £139k from proceeds of crime.
- Joint operations with BTP to target knife carriers on trains – Op Juco.
- Prison crime investigation team have average caseload of 120 crimes reported from HMP Bullingdon at any one time.
- Cherwell and West deployed Vigilant for the first time, tackling predatory behaviour in their NTE and used dedicated resources to secure a charge for a stranger rape

Prevention and reduction of Knife Crime


The LPA obtained funding through the Violence Reduction Unit to create Operation Moonart. This funding has enabled the LPA to conduct numerous disruptive operations, which include;

- 2 x Knife Test Purchase operations with Trading Standards covering businesses in Didcot, Wallingford and Wantage.
- 4 x Drugs dog operations in key hot spot locations identified through NH tasking and violent crime Covering Abingdon, Didcot, Wallingford and Wantage.

In addition to the above operations we have also focused out community engagement in the following areas;

- Knife Amnesty Bin at Abingdon Police Station
- 24 x Knife sweeps in hot spot locations identified through our NH tasking and violent crime dashboard
- Distribution of 10,000 #knife free stickers to food and drink outlets across the LPA.
- 2000 + young people received education sessions on preventing harm and dangers of knives through PC Mike Dix (School and youth engagement officer)



Theft of cycles in Oxford

- Down 21% in Oxford City since 2019/20
- Five prolific offenders arrested following joint investigation with OUSS and Westgate. Charged with over forty offences
- Safer Streets 1 funding, 5000 D locks issued, 8 secure street pods, free bike registration, hanger planned for Jericho
- Additional CCTV available at 7 flexible locations
- Pro active operations identified main offending groups as homelessness and drug addiction, revellers mainly at weekends and organised criminality

- Hi Visibility patrols with licensing linking into Pub Watch relaunch

Good Work

Oxford Stronghold team located and arrested an elusive stalker that had been stalking a woman that had refused to go on a second date. He had been following her home, taking pictures of her and was bombarding her with calls and messages. He was located with a knife on arrest.

Safer Streets 3

£426,000

- To make the journey into the city, the city and the journey home as safe as they can be
- Improved CCTV and lighting at key terminus locations Headington Hill, Blackbird Leys, Temple Cowley.
- Potential to expand to Witney, Didcot and Abingdon
- Safe spaces in Park End Street and Cornmarket to include Street Pastors, SCAS, phone charging and Taxi Marshalls

Crime Reductions

- **34%** Decrease in Residential Burglary = 1,250 v 827 (5 year average v Rolling 12 months)
- **22%** Reduction in Personal Robbery = 234 v 183 (5 year average v Rolling 12 months)
- **5%** Reduction in Serious Violence = 419 v 398 (Rolling 12 month comparison)

Crime Concerns

- **13%** Increase in All Crime = 42,593 v 48,181 (Rolling 12 months v 2018/19)
- **35%** Increase in Sexual Offences = 1,505 v 3,033 (Rolling 12 month comparison)

Outcomes

- **34%** Increase in positive outcomes for All Crimes = 5,173 v 6,933 (Rolling 12 months v 2018/19)
- **14%** Increase in (non domestic) violence with injury offences resulting in formal action being taken = 782 v 897 (Rolling 12 month comparison)
- **25%** Increase in Stalking Offences that result in arrest = 147 v 184 (12 month rolling comparison)
