IMPROVING AND EXTENDING PROVISION FOR CHILDREN AND YOUNG PEOPLE IN OXFORDSHIRE CHILL OUT BIDS FOR 2012/2013

Report by the Director for Children, Young People & Families

Introduction

1. Oxfordshire County Council believes that YOUTH MATTERS and has set up a fund of £100,000 to support work with children and young people across the county. The fund supports the aspirations of those working with children and young people in Oxfordshire to ensure all children and young people can access positive activities in their leisure-time by 2020.
2. We know that how children and young people spend their leisure-time has an important influence and impact on their resilience and their quality of life. Engaging in constructive activities can increase children and young people's positive attitudes, improve motivation, increase aspirations, develop social and life skills, enhance interpersonal skills and help build social capital. All of which is vital for children and young people to help them avoid taking risks such as experimenting with drugs/alcohol or being involved in anti-social behaviour and crime. Participation in positive activities can also help increase the resilience of vulnerable children and young people who are trying to rebuild their lives. For children and young people with physical or learning disabilities it can be a lifeline and reduce social isolation. For groups such as young carers, positive activities provide respite and can improve their outlook and quality of life.
3. Projects must meet the broad aspirations above and be targeted at children and young people 8 – 19 years (extended to 24 years for young people with learning disabilities).
4. The Chill Out Fund will consider a wide range of bids supporting children and young people's access to positive activity. Applications for funding are invited that comply with the following criteria:
 - Aimed at children and young people 8 – 19 (up to 24 for those with learning disabilities).
 - Show evidence of the involvement of young people in the application.
 - Demonstrate increased access to positive leisure-time activity.
 - Show matched funding from a source external to the county council.
 - Demonstrate the ability to account for funding.
5. Applications will be considered on a monthly basis.

The club access is a small element of a large project to renovate the adjacent playground. All children based at the school were asked to feed into the design of the new playground via a questionnaire, (The majority of After School Club users attend the school.) and other forms of consultation as outlined in the enclosed document.

What do you want to do? (please describe the project you want funding for)

West Oxford After School Club is based in a room at the back of the West Oxford School Canteen. Currently, the adjacent play area can only be accessed via the canteen. (marked in purple on plan one) We wish to install doors on the side of the building to offer direct access to the playground (highlighted on Plan One). This will initially give immediate access to the astro turf pitch which is a favourite of older club users, as well as access to the proposed Chill Out Zone for older children once built (early 2013)

Why is your project important? (and why do you want to do it?)

Children attending the After School Club enjoy making use of the adjacent outdoor spaces in the school grounds including the foundation^{met} and sports pitch areas. Children over the age of 8 are permitted to use these areas without direct adult supervision. Installing the doors will

- make the play areas more accessible for all children attending the club, encouraging increased outdoor play.
- improve the ability of play leaders to monitor the safety of over 8s when they are outside without direct supervision.

How will your project help or benefit children and young people in the community?

- It will improve the safety of older children attending the club.
- It will make outdoor play + physical activities more accessible.
- After School Club is also increasing its provision of Holiday Playschemes. The club is in a small room, so increased accessibility to the adjacent playground, especially once it is renovated this summer, will enhance the experience of children attending both after school club and the playschemes.

My name is Bethan Hand and I am 17 years of age. I am a member of the Youth Committee for the Faringdon and Villages Twinning Association in South Oxfordshire. I have taken part in our Youth Exchange since I was 12 years old. This has meant travelling to Le Mele, a similar sized town in Normandy, France and staying with a family and helping to make decisions about planning a week of activities for the Young French People when they visit us. Over the past few years I have travelled to Le Mele with the Faringdon Committee to be the Youth Representative at the joint committee meeting. I also have attended the joint committee meetings when they happen in Faringdon as well. The Twinning experience has now given me the courage to leave school and live in France for a year from September 2012!

I decided to apply for this grant as I am about to leave school and we will require new Young Leaders to take on this role. We hope to give our Youth Exchange an Olympic Theme this year and this will require considerable funding. The young people involved in the Exchange from Faringdon and Le Mele will not have had this opportunity before to experience the Olympics/Paralympics first hand.

Organise an exchange visit to Le Mele led by 2 Young Leaders who will be 18 or 19 years old.

Why is your project important? (and why do you want to do it?)

The benefit of an exchange programme for our community is tremendous as it represents :

- a real life context for a foreign language and therefore improved motivation and performance in languages in general
- friendship across national boundaries which is so important in our Olympic Year
- increased self awareness and assurance
- direct contact with another European country
- confidence and motivation to travel and explore others countries

Why do we wish to do it:

This is for the benefit of young people who live in Faringdon and surrounding villages but attend a variety of schools. Thus bringing together young people in a community with different backgrounds. The minibus covers several hundred miles a year transporting cadets from Didcot and surrounding villages to community events such as hospital fetes, Cholsey Model Mania and Harwell Model Railway Show where they perform car-parking, first aid and stewardship roles. In addition, the bus transports cadets to the main ATC activities across southern England, as far as Cornwall. These events include: Flying, Gliding, Shooting, First Aid training, Sports and Duke of Edinburgh activities. Didcot is a very active outdoor squadron and is often involved in adventure training activities such as road marching, hill walking and camping.

The squadron owns a large trailer used to carry marquees, tents and equipment, and this has to be towed by the minibus.

How will your project help or benefit children and young people in the community?

Didcot Squadron presently has just over 50 cadets who meet twice a week and have activities most weekends. These activities include those listed above, as well as academic studies leading to BTEC Certificate in Aviation Studies and the BTEC Diploma in Public Services, for some cadets. Please find attached a Summary document - detailing the partners who were asked to consult with the children and young people, who these children and young people are, where they have come from and what their involvements are with the Oxfordshire School Games. I've attached the collated responses from consultations that have taken place and emails from the partners who've not yet received the expected responses, providing approx timescales for the information to arrive. Any information from these consultations that has not arrived by the 16th April deadline for submission will be collated and sent on when received to add to this submission. The information from the young people will also be used in the mix for evaluating the 2012 Oxfordshire School Games from the perspective of children and young people.

What do you want to do? (please describe the project you want funding for)

The Oxfordshire School Games Level 3 festival aims to provide a high profile and inspiration final setting for the year round activity taking place in schools.

Above all we are seeking an increased access to leisure time activity for children and young people. Which will take the form of inspiring children and young people to carry on with their activity

A key factor is the integration and involvement of children and young people with a disability within the festival.

To this end we are submitting for additional support for:

- The children and young people with a disability taking part
- Providing information to increase participation after the event
- Capacity and training support for our volunteers

Why is your project important? (and why do you want to do it?)

The Oxfordshire School Games builds on the magic of the Olympics and Paralympics, helping to create a sporting legacy by encouraging young people to engage and enjoy sport.

It is a year long event and a celebration of Oxfordshire sport and will involve over 20,000 young people in sporting competitions within and between schools. It also offers additional opportunities for involvement in areas such as leadership - training young people to officiate competitions and support volunteer teams on the day, design and creation of Olympic torches, performances at the Opening Ceremonies to name a few.

"We feel that being able to design the torch that teams will carry gives us a chance to be involved in a different aspect of the games. It brings the spirit of the Olympics/Paralympics by designing a torch. It also targets different young people to get involved in the school games. We believe that the school games mirrors the Olympics/Paralympics by allowing different districts to compete against each other on a day of celebration of competition that also promotes the cultural element" **Yr 8 Students, Carterton Community College, West Oxfordshire, - designing torches for Olympic Ceremony**

Why do you want to be an Official at the Oxfordshire School Games?

"I would like to be an official at the School Games because I like helping the others out and seeing other people smile and seeing and helping them achieve new things" **Female, Age 17, Has learning and some social issues. She is a Level 1 Gymnastics Coach and one of the School Games Leaders for the Level 3 Oxfordshire School Games Festival and she helps out with Special School Sport.**

It is open to children of all abilities from schools across the County.

The Oxfordshire School Games focuses on the element of inclusion and on Day 1 of the festival features inclusive sports such as Boccia, Goal Ball and Seated Volley ball for both able bodied and young people with a disability.

When asked why is the Oxfordshire School Games important for young people with a Physical and/or Learning Challenge:

"Because it is fair to give everyone a fair opportunity. Treated the same. They won't feel pressured into joining in. they will work together as a team. Everyone will be trained to make everyone feel at ease. Everyone in a fun place to learn in a fun environment" **Female, Age 17, Has learning and some social issues. She is a Level 1 Gymnastics Coach and one of the School Games Leaders for the Level 3 Oxfordshire School Games Festival and she helps out with Special School Sport.**

The Oxfordshire School Games values for 2012 are the Olympic and Paralympic Values which are inclusive and designed to produce positive outcomes for all participating young people.

It is a celebration of sport and healthy physical activity, run by a partnership of Schools, School Games Organisers, school sport partnerships, sports national governing bodies and the core team of the Oxfordshire Sports Partnership

The Oxfordshire School Games have the full support of schools, local authorities and the participating sports, who will be coming together annually to manage this celebration of sport.

The Oxfordshire School Games will be a high profile event in the County Calendar and national funding has been secured until 2014.

The date for the 2012 final high profile Oxfordshire School Games Festival is the 5th and 6th July 2012. The venue is Oxford University Sports Complex, Iffley Road, Oxford, combined with additional sporting grounds and facilities on the adjacent Christchurch Sports ground and Magadalen College School to accommodate the vast number of sports and young people involved in the L3 Oxfordshire School Games Festival.

How will your project help or benefit children and young people in the community?

The Oxfordshire School Games are intended to encourage young people to become involved in sport and a healthy life style, whether as participants, coaches or sports leaders, or participating in the cultural elements of the opening ceremony or working on cultural projects that demonstrate the Olympic and Paralympics Values.

The benefits are increased participation for children at the margins of sport, creating more players, positive life style habits and more coaches and sports leaders into clubs.

It is providing new experiences for young people, giving them the opportunity to be part of a large scale sports competition utilizing the top class sports facilities of Iffley Road Sports Complex, where the Sub-4 minute mile was achieved by Sir Roger Bannister CBE; Christchurch and Magdalene College School.

We think that young people will be enthusiastic and it will encourage them to get involved in sports in the community. One student commented that it gives young people the opportunity to compete at all levels and get into the spirit of London 2012. The students felt that the young people would feel proud to represent their school and district and to be able to compete at a facility that is beyond the school field."

When asked What are the benefits for you learning to be a coach and an official?

"The benefits will be I will be able to help out and be able to lead a group when there is not enough people to lead the group. This will also benefit my CV. But the main point is where I get the pleasure of helping them out." Female, Age 17, Has learning and some social issues.
