IMPROVING AND EXTENDING PROVISION FOR CHILDREN AND YOUNG PEOPLE IN OXFORDSHIRE CHILL OUT BIDS FOR 2011

Report by the Director for Children, Young People & Families

Introduction

- 1. Oxfordshire County Council believes that YOUTH MATTERS and has set up a fund of £100,000 to support work with children and young people across the county. The fund supports the aspirations of those working with children and young people in Oxfordshire to ensure all children and young people can access positive activities in their leisure-time by 2020.
- We know that how children and young people spend their leisure-time has an important influence and impact on their resilience and their quality of life. Engaging in constructive activities can increase children and young people's positive attitudes, improve motivation, increase aspirations, develop social and life skills, enhance interpersonal skills and help build social capital. All of which is vital for children and young people to help them avoid taking risks such as experimenting with drugs/alcohol or being involved in anti-social behaviour and crime. Participation in positive activities can also help increase the resilience of vulnerable children and young people who are trying to rebuild their lives. For children and young people with physical or learning disabilities it can be a lifeline and reduce social isolation. For groups such as young carers, positive activities provide respite and can improve their outlook and quality of life.
- 3. Projects must meet the broad aspirations above and be targeted at children and young people 8 19 years (extended to 24 years for young people with learning disabilities).
- 4. The Chill Out Fund will consider a wide range of bids supporting children and young people's access to positive activity. Applications for funding are invited that comply with the following criteria:
 - Aimed at children and young people 8 19 (up to 24 for those with learning disabilities).
 - Show evidence of the involvement of young people in the application.
 - Demonstrate increased access to positive leisure-time activity.
 - Show matched funding from a source external to the county council.
 - Demonstrate the ability to account for funding.
- 5. Applications will be considered on a monthly basis.

Why is your project important? (and why do you want to do it?)

Access to the arts can have a huge impact on the lives of young people. From the previous projects we have run with Young carers, Virtual school and Parasol we have seen, and had reports of, real improvements in self confidence, behavior, self esteem and self expression.

Many of the young people we are targeting only access craft based art activities and we would like to give them the chance to access high quality workshops and see their work mounted and displayed in an exhibition. Young people will be encouraged and supported in inviting significant people in their lives to the exhibition.

Many groups working with disadvantaged young people are priced out of accessing high quality arts activities. We will offer these workshops for free and use our partner's knowledge of the young people they work with to target those who will really benefit from the project.

How will your project help or benefit children and young people in the community?

What do you want to do? (please describe the project you want funding for)

We want to bring youth arts companies from around the world together for 10 days at the end of July. These companies will include the Pegasus Youth Companies (Theatre, Dance, and Production), and youth companies from Perm, Grenoble, Croatia, Bonn, Leiden, and Gaza. Each participant will be provided with three meals, bus travel around Oxford, and accommodation. The Festival is unique in that it will be run largely by young people from Oxford, who have been involved from the beginning of the development process. Each company will have the opportunity to perform their prepared performance twice for other participants and the local community, and discuss their show the following day with festival participants. There will also be a Big Debate, centered on Human Rights & young people, at which there will be main speakers, including Young speakers from Oxford, Mark Thomas, comedian and activist and Iman Aoun, Ashtar Theatre in Ramallah Palastine, with the chance for questions from the floor. Participants will also take part in arts based workshops, which will eventually develop into a fully fledged performance involving all the participants which will be staged for the public at the end of the festival. The festival will be a chance for the members of Pegasus and other companies in Oxford, as well as all the visiting companies that participate, to experience a new kind of theatre and to share cultures from all over the world. This kind of festival is something virtually nonexistent in Oxford at the moment and we want to be the first to present this spectacular opportunity to add a fresh, cultural and exciting experience to the area.

Chloe Robinson (18 years) and Jamie Halliday (18 years) representatives from the *Mesh – Oxford International Youth Arts Festival* Planning Group (ages range from 14yrs to 19yrs) have written, in their own words, the importance of the festival to them and the rest of the people involved in the festival. These young people have been meeting regularly for over 6 months in preparation of this event, having organized all aspects and having in-put in to every element of the festival happening in July. I have also attached photos of the groups meeting s at the theatre along with *Mesh* up-dates which are written to the steering group each month, as well as poster designs that the young people have created for the publicity of the event. I will let them explain how important this festival is to them and the young people that will be visiting Oxford in July...

What do you want to do? (please describe the project you want funding for)

We want to bring youth arts companies from around the world together for 10 days at the end of July. These companies will include the Pegasus Youth Companies (Theatre, Dance, and Production), and youth companies from Perm, Grenoble, Croatia, Bonn, Leiden, and Gaza. Each participant will be provided with three meals, bus travel around Oxford, and accommodation. The Festival is unique in that it will be run largely by young people from Oxford, who have been involved from the beginning of the development process.

Each company will have the opportunity to perform their prepared performance twice for other participants and the local community, and discuss their show the following day with festival participants.

There will also be a Big Debate, centered on *Human Rights & young people*, at which there will be main speakers, including Young speakers from Oxford, Mark Thomas, comedian and activist and Iman Aoun, Ashtar Theatre in Ramallah Palastine, with the chance for questions from the floor.

Participants will also take part in arts based workshops, which will eventually develop into a fully fledged performance involving all the participants which will be staged for the public at the end of the festival. The festival will be a chance for the members of Pegasus and other companies in Oxford, as well as all the visiting companies that participate, to experience a new kind of theatre and to share cultures from all over the world. This kind of festival is something virtually nonexistent in Oxford at the moment and we want to be the first to present this spectacular opportunity to add a fresh, cultural and exciting experience to the area.

Why is your project important? (and why do you want to do it?)

Our festival is important because it will provide the local AND the international community with a chance to come together and learn from each other through drama, dance and production. There are not enough opportunities for young people to experience this kind of learning in the U.K. and even less in most of the countries our invited groups are from. Pegasus has always promoted this style of cultural exchange and recently started taking youth companies to various youth arts festivals in Europe. We feel we have learnt a lot from these experiences and don't see why we couldn't share them with the local community as well. From my own experience of performing at the *Recountre Youth Arts Festival* in Grenoble with Pegasus I can say without a doubt in my mind that it was one of the best 10 days of my life so far and a pivotal moment in my study and understanding of theatre. The festival however is not only for the performers, it will also impact the local area in a positive way, hopefully increasing an interest in the arts from young people and establishing itself as a highly anticipated event for people looking for a different kind of theatre.

How will your project help or benefit children and young people in the community?

Across the world, performing arts is used to explore and voice different cultures, ideologies, and events. MESH will allow the young people involved to show their take on the world they live in, and discover other perspectives. The local community will also gain from the experience of watching the shows brought by the international companies and the finale parade and performance. Giving young people a voice is one of the most important elements of the festival, whether they chose to do this through song, dance, production, or acting, as it allows them to express themselves to a wider audience other than their friends and family. In the case of the group that we hope to bring from Gaza, they will be able to escape from the strains they face at home, and can share their experiences with the other participants and wider community. This will give them a sense of release as they can share feelings that they may find difficult to express when in their own country. The other participants will gain a greater understanding of the Israeli-Palestinian conflict and its effects on the people of Gaza; this may then lead to them having more appreciation for their own situation.

As I have previously mentioned this festival is being planned and run by young members of Pegasus, and other theatres and schools throughout Oxfordshire, some as young as 14. This is not only going to be an incredible event for us but also a chance to prove to the world, which in my opinion does not value young people's input enough, that we are capable, intelligent and worth listening to. This does not just apply to us but also to the visiting companies who may be inspired to also stage their own festivals in the future. In the end even if no one who attends decides to go on and make their own festival or use this experience in their CVs and UCAS applications at least we'll get to create some awesome drama which, from my point of view, is just as important as all the rest. So thanks for reading this application and I hope you feel our explanations have informed you well enough to make a decision.

Describe how children & young people have been involved in this application (please attach any supporting documentation to demonstrate their involvement)

Informal consultations were conducted with young people who participated in Dip 'n Chill 2010 at the end of the season in September 2010. In response to a very high increase in uptake the previous year, we had altered the age qualification and made Dip 'n Chill 2010 available to all young people in school years 7 – 11, effectively limiting the sessions to 11-16 year olds rather than giving access to year 6 primary school children and older teenagers in the 16-18 group as well. This had had the effect of reducing the overall numbers but providing more space for the core group of users and was generally well received. A slightly less crowded and calmer atmosphere had also made the sessions more enjoyable for young people who may have felt vulnerable in the past and made it easier for staff to support the integration of those with specific difficulties. Participants felt that Dip 'n Chill has become part of the social scene for young people in this age group in Chipping Norton.

What do you want to do? (please describe the project you want funding for)

Dip 'n Chill at The Lido has been running successfully for 4 years. The sessions run every Tuesday from June until September from 7.30 – 9pm and are free to young people in school years 7-11 years. In 2011 we are proposing to offer 14 sessions. High staffing levels ensure that a lively atmosphere can be safely maintained, with music, water polo and pool games. A café service with soft drinks and hot food will also run at each session. Individuals are required to register on their first attendance with contact details/medical info and also to sign a Code of Conduct (along with a parental signature) along very similar lines to those used at secondary schools.

Why is your project important? (and why do you want to do it?)

Young people in Chipping Norton and especially in the surrounding villages feel that there are very few places in which they can 'hang out'. The Lido provides a safe, supervised setting for young people to meet and socialise. In 2010 we had 352 attendees at 16 sessions with 110 young people registered. For the first time, over 50% of the participants came from villages where there are very few facilities or dedicated activities for young people. In addition, Dip 'n Chill is used by young people from the traveller community where parents have trust and confidence in The Lido staff. The sessions provide what is often a first opportunity for those at the younger end of the age range to go out in the evening with friends and without parents. The project is regularly commended by parents, police, Chipping Norton School, and Town, District and County Councillors, and we have the ongoing support of our local Police Community Support Officer who made regular visits to the scheme to support both the Lido team and to engage with young people. In 2010 we also had a dedicated youth worker present at sessions to help support potentially vulnerable participants – this youth worker subsequently trained as a lifeguard and is now a member of the regular Lido team. The Lido is a partner in the RUSH group in Chipping Norton (along with WODC, Youth Service, Oxfordshire Playbus, CN Theatre, CN School, Young Carers service, Town Council) which aims to improve provision for vulnerable young people. It is generally agreed that Dip 'n Chill is reaching this target group as there are very few barriers to participation.

How will your project help or benefit children and young people in the community?

This project has been developed with OAYP's 52 affiliated youth clubs. Young people at clubs across Oxfordshire have been consulted through meetings with OAYP staff, through surveys and through representation on the Management Committee. Young people identified that they wanted:

Young people have been involved in this application by virtue of the fact that Chutney and Chips is a completely youth-led project. Being an original production, written, produced and directed by students, all the decisions have been made by young people.

The core team (the scripwriters, directors and producers) founded the production and submitted the initial bid for a night at the Oxford Playhouse. This involved answering questions such as why we wanted to do the show, why at the Oxford Playhouse and what our marketing strategy would be, as well as including individual biographies and statements. At this stage, only four of us were involved in the project, since there was no point in involving others unless we were able to secure the slot at the Oxford Playhouse. Therefore, that bid was completed by having regular meetings, brainstorming ideas collectively and then distributing the questions amongst ourselves.

Subsequent to securing the night at the Oxford Playhouse, the decision-making was delegated to the various teams. These teams are detailed in the last section of this form. It is the producer's job to find a marketing team, sponsorship team, designer and production manager, the latter of which finds the rest of the production team. Once all the teams were in place, the heads of all of the teams handled each area, after being given an overview of what was required of them by the producer.

As a result, Chutney and Chips has only reached the stage it has due to decision-making that takes place at all levels. Due to the fact that it is the producer's job to finance the show, the producer has written this application. However, the core team and sponsorship team were consulted about this application in a meeting, and certain points have been lifted from previous funding applications, which were written

collectively. An example of such a funding application is one that we sent to the 'Magdalen Players' (this has been enclosed in this application). It is evident that the Magdalen Players application involved young people due to the numerous biographies and statements in it from some of the key members of Chutney and Chips Productions.

What do you want to do? (please describe the project you want funding for)

'Chutney and Chips' is Oxford University's debut Bollywood-inspired theatre production. It is going to be staged on Saturday 4th June 2011 at the Oxford Playhouse. The proceeds of the production go to charity.

Chutney and Chips is essentially a modern Western take on a proverbial Bollywood love story. The production tells the tale of a simple girl from London, who is constantly trying to break free from the confines of her prescriptive lifestyle, whilst simultaneously staying respectful to her deep-rooted cultural beliefs. At the same time, we learn about the story of an outgoing and charismatic boy studying at Oxford, who is eager to make the most of university life, but under pressure by his parents to continue the family business and find a wife.

At its very heart, the play sends out a message about the struggle posed to British-born ethnic individuals in maintaining the duality of cultures. However, ultimately, it is a celebration of the symbiosis of cultures.

The production will be filled with a variety of music, dances and costumes, reflecting the diversity of the society that we live in, and ensuring that the audience will be enthused and entertained throughout.

The production will include students from the University of Oxford, but also from Oxford Brookes. However, we are keen to make this show as inclusive as possible for the youth of Oxford in general, and therefore, we have got in touch with the OYAP Trust (which was set up to bring the experience of participating in the arts to young people in Oxfordshire) in order to involve any of its members who are interested in our production. The OYAP Trust particularly aims to help those who have not participated before or who are 'at risk'. Chutney and Chips Productions looks forward to helping the most vulnerable young people in society to engage in something productive and worthwhile, encouraging them to boost their confidence and keep away from bad habits.

The show will benefit 90 young people due to the sheer amount of organisation and creativity involved in the project. There are a number of different teams involved in the production, including the following: core, creative, production, marketing, and sponsorship. The plethora of tasks required to be completed in order to make this show a resounding success, will ensure that those involved will benefit from a definite boost to their skill sets. At university, it is only too easy to refrain from being pro-active. However, due to the unprecedented and fun nature of Chutney and Chips, 90 students have been galvanised into action.

Furthermore, due to the fact that this is the first show of its kind in Oxford, there is no doubt that this show will inspire and motivate young people to think outside the box, as we have, and aim to achieve something truly unique and spectacular.

Why is your project important? (and why do you want to do it?)

Chutney and Chips is important and significant for a range of reasons:

- 1) It is vital that Chutney and Chips is seen through as a project because of the broad message that it sends out to youth. The team that founded Chutney and Chips Productions were told at the outset that the production would be unlikely to materialise. We were told that the chances of securing a slot at the Oxford Playhouse were minimal, and that we should consider putting on a smaller production in one of the college's theatres. Likewise, we were told that we would have little luck with sponsorship. Despite being told that we were unlikely to be able to achieve our ambitions, we believed in our idea and our ability to realise it, and the outcome was positive. Ultimately, we want Chutney and Chips to act as a reminder to young people of the power that we have to realise our dreams. Aspirations should never be compromised in the face of difficulty.
- 2) Chutney and Chips is important because of the message that it communicates. The production is a celebration of the fusion of British and Asian culture, and this is reflected within our cast, teams, dances and storyline. In an age of increasing multi-culturalism, it is vital that we celebrate diversity. A recent ONS Report said that Oxford has the second highest proportion of ethnic minorities amongst South East towns. This suggests that there is even more cause for celebration in Oxford. Chutney and Chips aims to do this in a fun and entertaining way, thereby uniting the Oxford community.
- 3) It is crucial to give minorities in communities a voice. 19% of all students at Oxford University are BME (Black and minority ethnic). 28% of Oxford's residents are from an ethnic minority. We may only be a minority, but we are growing, and more importantly, we have a story to tell. We would truly appreciate the chance to be heard.
- 4) The students in the production are involved in many different capacities. This means that there are an overwhelming amount of skills that can be boosted and acquired through participation in Chutney and Chips. These will be detailed in the next section. However, as well as gaining core skills, this show will create a brand new network of students in Oxford. Due to the fact that such a range of students will be involved (from Oxford University, Oxford Brookes and from local schools/youth organisations), the links between students, regardless of age or background, will be strengthened. The Chill Out fund ultimately aims to empower youth. What better way to do this than by facilitating a production which brings the youth closer, enabling them to learn and grow alongside each other?
- 5) Proceeds from Chutney and Chips go to charity. The charities we have chosen are: CAREducation Trust, The Malambe Trust and Vision Bangladesh. The first two charities are both educational charities. As students, we appreciate and value education, and we therefore chose these charities in the hope of benefitting those in a less fortunate position than us. Our third charity, Vision Bangladesh, aims to eliminate avoidable blindness across Bangladesh by the year 2020. Chutney and Chips is therefore also important because it will have a positive impact in communities across the world, as well as in Oxford.
- 6) As well as being beneficial to a range of students, the Oxford Community and the wider community, Chutney and Chips is a landmark event for the University of Oxford. Many of the other Russell Group Universities have produced shows celebrating diversity for years. Despite the fact that Oxford University prides itself on being at the forefront of innovation, it appears that we have failed so far in this area. Chutney and Chips Productions feels obliged to ensure that students within Oxford are no longer denied the benefits of such a tradition. We would like to lay down a legacy that will endure for years to come.

We would like to see Chutney and Chips through because of everything it represents and the fact that it can have such far-reaching beneficial consequences. Furthermore, most of us have never had so much fun doing something as productive as this.

How will your project help or benefit children and young people in the community?

Chutney and Chips will benefit the young people in our community through enabling them to acquire valuable life skills. There are five teams involved in Chutney and Chips: core, creative, production, marketing and sponsorship. Regardless of which team you are involved in, every student will gain leadership, organisation, teamwork, communication and interpersonal skills. All of these skills are important for one's growth as an individual, as well as for future employment prospects.

Furthermore, every student involved will gain specialist skills in their particular area of work. The kinds of specialist skills gained for each team are discernable from their responsibilities, which are detailed below:

Core

Involves: Producer, Directors, Scripwriters

- Deciding on the overall purpose of the show, its general storyline, the cast and any extras i.e. whether
 or not we should have a celebrity appearance, whether we should offer Asian food during the interval
- Responsible for writing and submitting the bid for the Oxford Playhouse and attending any interviews
- Producer: Responsible for financing the show, managing the accounts and overseeing the smoothrunning of key elements of the show
- Scriptwriters: Responsible for writing the script
- Directors: Responsible for bringing the script to life with the cast

Creative

Involves: Dancers and Actors

- The dancers and actors can refine and showcase their artistic abilities.
- Due to the light-hearted nature of Chutney and Chips, it has encouraged those students who are less
 accustomed to the intimidating Oxford drama scene, to participate. This means that it has created a
 brand new opportunity for young people who otherwise would have been too shy to showcase their
 talents.
- There are a number of seasoned actors and dancers who have only ever acted in these types of
 productions at school. Were it not for Chutney and Chips, these actors and dancers, although not
 intimidated by the Oxford drama scene, would not have had an outlet in which to showcase their
 talents.
- Our collaboration with the OYAP Trust will ensure that the opportunities in our show are offered to those young people who are most in need of them.

Production

Involves: Production Manager, Designer, Stage Manager, Lighting Designer, Sound Designer, Backstage Team

- All members of the production team are technical experts in their particular field. For instance, the
 designer is responsible for all visual elements of the production, including backdrops and props.
 Chutney and Chips will give the designer a chance to improve her artistic abilities.
- Some of the members of the production team have held the same role in previous productions, and
 will therefore be able to improve their skills further by participating. For others, such as our designer,
 it is the first time they have held such a large role, and as a result, they will acquire brand new
 technical skills.

Marketing

- Designing and distributing the leaflets/flyers, setting up the website, organising the launch party and street performance, responsible for publicity and responsible for ensuring that the production sells out.
- Theses tasks involve a lot of brainstorming and administrative work.

Sponsorship

Responsible for securing funds for Chutney and Chips, which involves extensive research, persuasive oral and written skills, and excellent interpersonal skills.

As well as the general life skills and specialist skills that the young people will gain, as mentioned above, they will feel empowered to be participating in such a novel and unprecedented production, and we hope that this will help instill in them an optimistic mindset, which can be applied to all areas of life. Further, as mentioned above, Chutney and Chips will create a new student network within Oxford, which will bring likeminded, talented individuals together. In this sense, we believe that Chutney and Chips will have a lasting positive effect on the attitude of the young people involved.
