## IMPROVING AND EXTENDING PROVISION FOR CHILDREN AND YOUNG PEOPLE IN OXFORDSHIRE CHILL OUT BIDS FOR 2012/2013

## Report by the Director for Children's Services

#### Introduction

- 1. Oxfordshire County Council believes that YOUTH MATTERS and has set up a fund of £100,000 to support work with children and young people across the county. The fund supports the aspirations of those working with children and young people in Oxfordshire to ensure all children and young people can access positive activities in their leisure-time by 2020.
- We know that how children and young people spend their leisure-time has an important influence and impact on their resilience and their quality of life. Engaging in constructive activities can increase children and young people's positive attitudes, improve motivation, increase aspirations, develop social and life skills, enhance interpersonal skills and help build social capital. All of which is vital for children and young people to help them avoid taking risks such as experimenting with drugs/alcohol or being involved in anti-social behaviour and crime. Participation in positive activities can also help increase the resilience of vulnerable children and young people who are trying to rebuild their lives. For children and young people with physical or learning disabilities it can be a lifeline and reduce social isolation. For groups such as young carers, positive activities provide respite and can improve their outlook and quality of life.
- 3. Projects must meet the broad aspirations above and be targeted at children and young people 8 19 years (extended to 24 years for young people with learning disabilities).
- 4. The Chill Out Fund will consider a wide range of bids supporting children and young people's access to positive activity. Applications for funding are invited that comply with the following criteria:
  - Aimed at children and young people 8 19 (up to 24 for those with learning disabilities).
  - Show evidence of the involvement of young people in the application.
  - Demonstrate increased access to positive leisure-time activity.
  - Show matched funding from a source external to the county council.
  - Demonstrate the ability to account for funding.
- 5. Applications will be considered on a monthly basis.

## Project description?

This project will directly engage with 80 young people in Oxfordshire - (1 NEET group and 3 groups with learning disabilities), and over 350 young people in total. Funding is required to support two elements of the overall project.

The first element is the training and filmmaking in Bicester with the NEET group based at the Courtyard Centre. Here, Chill Out funding would cover the costs of 1 lead Film maker and a support Film maker over 10days and £300 of film expenses. Total £3900.

The second element is to support the training of the young people in Bicester in event management skills leading to a screening event where their film will be premiered. Chill Out funding is required to cover the costs of 2 Event Managers over 2.5 days. Total £900.

Describe how children & young people have been involved in this application (please attach any supporting documentation to demonstrate their involvement)

As part of the First Light application for the 'Moving the Image' project we held consultation sessions with 4 groups of young people (80 in total). 1 groups was NEET(Not in Education, Employment of Training) from Bicester (Courtyard) and 3 groups had learning disabilities.

From these meetings and brainstorming sessions it is clear that all groups were enthusiastic about making films and using the medium as a way of expressing their ideas. The groups came up with the following scenarios:

Bicester. 'Mindless Consumption' – A docu/drama horror exploring excessive consumption in society played out through a Zombie backdrop

Woodeaton Manor. Whodunit thriller set in a 16<sup>th</sup> century manor

Iffley Mead Oxford. White Sofa – A short film about 4 young people trapped in a parallel world of muddy jungles and old houses. A world accessed through the white sofa - but which world is reality?

Iffley Mead Oxford. 'Mr Robinson' - A TV crew arrive at Iffley Mead school. In the science lab Mr Robinson mistakenly drinks a zombie potion. Chaos! The only way to escape is to find the secret

door that takes them back in time and restores normality

What do you want to do? (please describe the project you want funding for)

### **Filmmaking**

We would like to apply for Chill Out funding to support 2 elements of the 'Moving the Image' project. This project will directly engage with 80 young people in Oxfordshire. (1 NEET groups and 3 groups with Learning disability) and over 350 young people in total.

The Chill Out fund will support the training and filmmaking in Bicester with the NEET group based at the Courtyard Centre. The professional filmmakers will assist the young people in developing the script as well as run technical skills sessions and oversee the filming and post production over 10 days.

(Chill Out funding to cover the costs of 1 lead Film maker and a support Film maker over 10 days, and £300 of film expenses. Total £3900)

### **Event Management**

We would also like the Chill Out funding to support the training of the young people in Bicester in event management skills leading to a screening event where their film will be premiered.

10 Young people will be involved in the organization and running of the film event at the Courtyard (Bicester) in March where the film that has been made will be publicly screened.

Young people will develop publicity (print and electronic) and set up social network sites. They will send out the press release and email invitations and take on responsibilities on the night (technical support and stewarding). They may also want to develop their own marketing techniques which will be encouraged.

What do you want to do? (please describe the project you want funding for)

We would like to take 26 children who have autism or are young carers to a sibling with autism, go karting.

This would be split into 2 groups due to safety restrictions.

The children ages 8-12 years will attend an indoor go kart session. This will be on electric go karts with an inflatable track at Blackbird Leys leisure centre. We would hire a room for the children to eat their packed lunches before the go karting as this would give the children a chance to socially interact and for the parents to meet.

The more support parents/carers have the better they are able to cope with difficulties with their children, which would ultimately benefit the children. Therefore promotion of support groups for

parents will also take place during the lunch.

The children would then go to the hall for the go karting. The children will wear name stickers and be encouraged to cheer each other on, this promotes team spirit. The children will practice skills like turn taking and maneuvering the go karts.

Everybody at this session will be a winner and will be awarded with a medal; this will boost self confidence and encourage the children to talk to others about their experience when they return home.

The children and young people aged 13-24 with autism will attend an outdoor go karting session on a real race track near Cowley, Oxford.

The circuit is set within a stadium, so the spectator areas are fantastic.

Well maintained Sodi Karts provide the speed, whilst the exciting circuit provides the thrills and spills. A computerized lap timing system will be able to accurately inform you of how you're performing. Helmets and race suits are provided. Speed is the name of the game as you whizz around the floodlit 360 meter circuit. With an outrageously quick straight and hair pin bends you are guaranteed the drive of your life. A great venue for some excellent group fun. This will give them the 'real' race driver experience. This project will give the children the chance to experience something that they never normally would.

The children will have a chance to do some practice laps then it's on to the main races.

The children will complete 2 races of 20 laps each.

OASIS will have exclusive access to the track at the time of this event.

Everybody at this session will be a winner and will be awarded with a medal; this will boost self confidence and encourage the children to talk to others about their experience when they return home. All the children will have the opportunity to have their photo taken on the winner podium.

## Why is your project important? (and why do you want to do it?)

We are a friendly charity run by parent volunteers for those bringing up children and young adults on the Autistic Spectrum. We welcome all parents, carers and individuals and can cater for all aspects of the spectrum, this includes classic Autism, Asperger's Syndrome and other related conditions such and Sensory Processing Disorder and Developmental Delay.

OASIS aims to create a supportive community through family events, informal coffee and chat groups, evening speaker meetings and regular updates on our website of county wide events and information that will be useful to all.

We want to run this project to help prevent social isolation that many children and young people on the autistic spectrum suffer. We will be holding this day so that it gives families an opportunity to meet up as a group and allow the children on the spectrum and their siblings to be themselves. It is also a great way to meet other parents and carers who share the same experiences. Going as a group gives families the opportunity to try activities they would normally try and to get out in public as this can be hard with disabled children as some people stare or make comments. We aim to provide a relaxing family day out, often enabling children with ASD to try new activities at an autism-friendly venue and giving parents the opportunity to meet and exchange ideas. We hope this project will give parents/carers the confidence to take their children out in the wider community.

We hope this experience will widen the potential of the children and we hope that some of the children will discover a new talent and hobby.

## How will your project help or benefit children and young people in the community?

Being able to go out into the community is so important for these children to develop their self confidence and their independence skills, as well as the community itself to see autistic children. Trips out such as this, gives these children, who often because of their difficulties with social interactions and communication have few or no friends, the opportunity to meet with other children on a fun and relaxed day out and practice social and interaction skills. This has led to spontaneous friendships starting between the group, which we are eager to continue growing between the group, on days out such as this.

Being in the community will help the children to learn/practice social skills.

Taking turns on the go karts will encourage turn taking skills and cheering on other people will encourage team building.

Describe how children & young people have been involved in this application (please attach any supporting documentation to demonstrate their involvement)

Young people from Cholsey and its surroundings have welcomed the Youth Club. About 35 youngsters have attended over the year since the Club re-opened. The members value the Club and are keen for it to continue and grow. The members have been fully involved in formulating rules for the Club, and are encouraged to discuss any issues which arise.

The youth club members have put forward ideas for how to use the space in the new youth room. They have told the committee what sort of activities they would most like to engage in, and how they would like the room laid out and furnished. The young people are very excited at the prospect of having their own, dedicated space within the new Cholsey Pavilion. They can see the building being constructed in the Recreation Ground and are enthusiastic about the Club being welcomed into this important new village facility.

What do you want to do? (please describe the project you want funding for)

We want to fund a professional youth worker to manage the sessions and train the volunteer staff for another year.

We want to relocate the Youth Club to a dedicated youth room in the new Cholsey Pavilion. The new room will need to be fitted with a sink, cupboards and counters for a tuck shop area. It will also need storage cupboards, secure units for games and audio-visual equipment, and furniture for craft

activities and a lounge area. The new space will enable us to make full use of equipment which we already own (like computers and a projector). It will also give the Club a more homely and relaxing environment which should help foster positive interactions.

## Why is your project important? (and why do you want to do it?)

Many of our volunteers are aged between 18 and 26. The volunteers are a fantastic resource, and the young people relate well to them. It is essential for us to continue training the staff and establishing a Club which promotes positive interactions, constructive activity and controls any troublesome behaviour, so that the members can gain the maximum benefit from attending. The Club is still in its early stages of setting boundaries to behaviour and establishing good relationships between the staff and members. A significant proportion of our members are in danger of becoming NEET (not in education, employment or training). The Club is proving itself as a place which they are keen to attend and where they realize they have to behave reasonably and responsibly.

The move to the new Cholsey Pavilion will enable us to offer more activities to our youngsters, and will reduce the time spent moving equipment at the start and end of each session. Having a permanent space for the Club will also promote a sense of ownership of the Club by its members. The new space will enable us to make full use of equipment which we already own (like computers and a projector). It will also give the Club a more homely and relaxing environment which should help in the smooth running of the Club.

## How will your project help or benefit children and young people in the community?

The project will give young people in the village a safe, welcoming place to go where they will experience positive interactions with adults and be encouraged to show constructive, co-operative behaviour. The establishment of a permanent base for the Club in the new Pavilion will help the youngsters feel part of the wider community and encourage them to take responsibility for taking care of this new resource.
