If the Council's proposed alternative figures for aggregates provision are used as the basis, the landbanks at the end of 2010 are increased to:

- Soft Sand – 10.2 years (at 0.25 million tonnes per year);
- Sharp Sand & Gravel – 5.9 years (at 1.01 million tonnes per year);
- Total Sand & Gravel – 6.7 years (at 1.26 million tonnes per year);
- Crushed Rock – 19.5 years (at 0.63 million tonnes per year).
