Individual reviews are a statutory function delivered under the Care Act 2014 by social care staff. The review function supports people to receive the right level of support at home.  Work undertaken previously has shown that it is possible to release existing spend by reviewing home support packages of care to ensure they have the right level of on-going support.  This proposal has been developed to support the council to set a balanced budget for 2021/22.
Proposals  Explain the detail of the proposals, including why this has been decided as the best course of action.	This proposal aims to deliver a saving of £0.6m in 2021/22 by completing individual reviews of people receiving support at home to ensure they have the right level of on-going support.  Savings proposal 20AD12 showed that it is possible to release existing spend through on-going reviews of home support packages of care to ensure they have the right level of on-going support. Budgeted reductions of £1.2m were achieved in 2019/20 and a further £1.2m is expected to be achieved in 2020/21.  While it is becoming more challenging to add to that it is estimated that if reviews continue at the current rate a further £0.6m reduction in spend can be achieved by 2021/22. That capacity will be released back to be used for other people who require support from Adult Social Care.
Evidence / Intelligence	This proposal is based on savings delivered by undertaking individual reviews in 2019/20 and 2020/21.

Savings proposal 20AD12 and previous work has shown that on-going reviews of home support packages not only ensure that people have the right level of on-going support but also release existing spend.

Budgeted reductions of £1.2m were achieved in 2019/20 and a further £1.2m is expected to be achieved in 2020/21.
