Report by the Director for Children, Young People & Families

Introduction

- 1. Oxfordshire County Council believes that YOUTH MATTERS and has set up a fund of £100,000 capital to support work with children and young people across the county. The fund supports the aspirations of those working with children and young people in Oxfordshire to ensure all children and young people can access positive activities in their leisure-time by 2020.
- 2. How children and young people spend their leisure time has an important influence and impact on their resilience and quality of life. Engaging in constructive activities can increase their positive attitudes, improve motivation, increase aspirations, develop social and life skills, enhance interpersonal skills and help build social capital. Participation in positive activities can also help increase resilience of vulnerable children and young people who are trying to rebuild their lives. For children and young people with physical or learning disabilities it can be a lifeline and reduce social isolation. For groups such as young carers, positive activities provide respite and can improve their outlook and quality of life.
- 3. Projects must meet the broad aspirations above and be targeted at children and young people 8 19 years (extended to 24 years for young people with learning disabilities).
- 4. The Chill Out Fund will consider a wide range of bids supporting children and young people's access to positive activity. Applications for funding are invited that comply with the following criteria:
 - Capital funding
 - Aimed at children and young people 8 19 (up to 24 for those with learning disabilities).
 - Show evidence of the involvement of young people in the application.
 - Demonstrate increased access to positive leisure-time activity.
 - Show matched funding from a source external to the county council.
 - Demonstrate the ability to account for funding.

Describe why this project is important

Some young people visit the gym but others with illnesses or a disability (such as one resident has diabetes and it not allowed to use the gym due to health and safety reasons) are not able to access facilities. A wii fit system would enable them to get exercise and have fun together in what is the only safe communal space residents have together. The lounge is the only 'chill out' area in the foyer and needs to be clean and comfortable. Residents enjoy having guests at the foyer and need to use the IT facility to keep in touch with family and friends and to do job search and basic skills training. The current IT facilities are very old and don't work well and the chairs are broken.

All young people need to access exercise facilities to enable them to stay fit and engage with other youngsters in the local area. It is hoped this will promote a positive image of the Foyer and a general sense of wellbeing amongst the many new residents who have very complex needs. The foyer is at the very heart of Abingdon town center so its young people need to present a positive image to Abingdon's other residents

Describe how children/young people have been involved in this application (please attach any supporting documentation to demonstrate their involvement)

The project is for a Youth Media Centre for young people in Oxford. They will be involved in a range of online local broadcasting including internet television and radio programming. Young people have been involved in this application by drafting out the types of programming that this media centre will be broadcasting, as well as working out how they will be selecting the presenters for each of the TV and radio programs that will be aired. 100 questionnaires were completed by young people to decide this. The project equipment has been researched by our youth committee for this application.

3. Access to positive activity in children/young people's leisure-time Describe the project

The Oxford Youth Media Project will provide training, broadcast work experience, entertainment and information for local youths. During the week young people will be trained in broadcast production and presenting skills in preparation of broadcasts that will be made on Friday evenings and Saturday and Sunday afternoons. With the TV broadcasts they will learn to film, edit and broadcast their programs on our hosting broadcasting equipment. The radio broadcasts will feature live Youth Talk events along with and talk show programs. There will also be a special emphasis on playing music that has been produced by local young people.

Describe why this project is important

The Oxford Youth Media Project will give local youths a chance to air their views and provide an outlet for their talent. We will develop programs such as a News item show to broadcast any issues that concern them or where they may need to get correct information. Our entertainment shows will focus on Oxford young people who deserve opportunities to be seen and heard by wider audiences. The training for the project production team will give youths the skills from which they can go on to further media training, or to seek employment with larger broadcasters. They can also use the project to produce programs that may be accepted by other companies which will help them to develop their own TV and radio careers.

By the end of March 2011, this project would have trained a minimum of 20 young people in broadcasting. This training will be QCA accredited and they will be able to move on to further training from this project. The project will give youths a voice in the media and a chance to give recognition for outstanding local achievement. Issues that affect local youths will be covered by our project and this will get more young people engaged with issues that affect their local communities. We will encourage young people from different communities to work together. They will be encouraged to produce short documentaries so they can teach each other about their different cultures. The main impact from this will be to increase and encourage community diversity
