

Behaviour for Learning

Classroom Rules

- 1 Arrive on time for every lesson.
- 2 Sit in your seating plan position or where the teacher tells you to sit.
- 3 Turn off and put away all electrical equipment (Phones, I-Pods, MP3 players etc).

Behaviour for Learning

Corridor Rules

- 1 Wait quietly in single file outside a classroom if you cannot enter.
- 2 Walk quietly on the left in corridors and on the stairs.
- 3 Respect other people's property.
- 4 Speak respectfully to others without using abusive language.
- 5 Refrain from eating chewing gum.
- 6 Follow the instructions of all academy staff.
- 7 Keep the academy tidy and put all litter in the bin.
- 8 Eat and drink in the Restaurant.
- 9 Remove your coat inside the academy.
- 10 Remove hats/caps/hoods inside the academy.
- 11 Avoid inappropriate physical contact with other students and do not get involved in play fighting.

Behaviour for Learning

There are no warnings for these misbehaviours. A 30 minute detention (C3) is given if you are seen.....

- 1 Running / shouting in the academy building or disruptive behaviour in the corridor.
- 2 Wearing a hat/hood/cap in the academy.
- 3 Wearing a coat in the academy.
- 4 Eating or drinking in the wrong place.
- 5 Being late to lessons (5 minutes).
- 6 Being out of lessons without written permission or a pass.
- 7 Swearing in the hearing of a member of staff.
- 8 Play fighting or inappropriate physical contact.
- 9 Talking in assembly.

Restaurant

- 10 Not using the bins for all rubbish/unwanted food
- 11 Throwing food

Behaviour for Learning

The following behaviours mean you may be sent home / possible exclusion/parental meeting

- 1. Verbal or physical abuse of staff.
- 2. Fighting.
- 3. Possession or use of alcohol or drugs.
- 4. Bringing a dangerous item into the academy
- 5. Maliciously setting off the fire alarm.
- 6. Deliberate damage to or theft of academy property
- 7. Smoking in the academy.
- 8. Bullying or racist behaviour
- 9. Walking out of a lesson without permission or truanting a lesson.
- 10. Deliberate defiance towards a member of staff.
- 11. Making malicious or unfounded allegations against a member of staff.
