Financial Final Decision on Expansion of Queensway Primary School to 2 Forms of Entry (2fe)

(Cabinet, 26 November 2013)

Cabinet considered and approved a proposed increase to the published admission number from 30 to 60 children at Queensway Primary School in Banbury, on a permanent basis from September 2014. This will eventually increase the school's total capacity from its current 277 places in Years Reception – Year 6 to a maximum of 420.

Agreed on the basis of Scrutiny Procedure Rule 18(a) where any delay would seriously prejudice the Council's interests, in that the Cabinet's role would be negated by referral to the Schools' Adjudicator if the decisions were not taken within two months of the end of the Statutory Notices, in this case being 10 December 2013.
