ITEM 8: ARINGDON: TOWN CENTRE: PROPOSED 20MPH ZONE

I am writing to add my support for the item on the agenda for the decision meeting this Thursday regarding the proposed 20 MPH Zone in Faringdon Town Centre.

Having seen the results from the consultation I can see that the majority of respondents were in favour of the action and I would like to add my support to this.

For many years residents have wanted a change in the speed limit in Faringdon Town Centre. One of the roads that would be affected is home to a junior school that in September will become a full entry primary school, with many more children walking along the pavements and crossing the road in the vicinity. It is an appropriate time therefore to reduce the speed there and throughout the town.

I understand that Faringdon Town Council is fully in support of this action, and I endorse their views as well as those residents who have written in support of the proposal. Of those people who questioned the reduction in the speed limit in the consultation, I believe many were concerned that it may not be adequately enforced. This is a concern, but I believe that this proposal would been advanced if officers in charge did not think this change was a viable option and would like to see the results of the initial installation of signage and any other measure that have been suggested. If it appears that the new measures are not adequate and the speed limit is not being adhered to, perhaps we could explore actions into the future.

At this point in time, I fully endorse the sentiments of the town council and residents in support of this action and ask that Cllr Bearder approve the proposal at the decision meeting this Thursday, the 27th of Jan.
