This annex is for information. It outlines political groups' notional entitlements to membership of committees under the revised political proportionality rules in red.
Current seats are in black. The total number of committee places is 91 . Currently the Lib Dem /Green Alliance is entitled to 35 seats, the Conservative Independent Alliance is entitled to 32 and the Labour and Co-operative Party is entitled to 23. The Independent Councillor has 2 committee seats (Remuneration Committee and the Planning and Regulation Committee).
