Prior to the school street trial, I felt the road was very unsafe for children and parents because many cars parked along it (including on double yellow lines or the zig zag lines next to school) and many cars drove along it, some doing inconsiderate driving such as 3 point turns where they would overhang onto the pavement due to the road being quite narrow. This made it hard for children to cross safely, and I saw a young child nearly knocked over when they unexpectedly ran across the road (luckily the van was going slowly). I have a child in year 6 who walks to school by

themselves, they have a mature outlook but even so, I was particularly concerned about the road being dangerous to cross for children who may have less experience.

The road is so much better since the school street trial began. In the first week or two, I felt there was a festive or carnival atmosphere, with parents standing on the pavements or road, you could sense that everyone felt safer and happier (I did not expect this outcome, but it really boosted the sense of school community between parents and families). I think the road is much safer now there are fewer cars on it.

I would invite the organisers to review the cars which are currently allowed down the street; there is frequently a taxi, but I feel this is a bit of a loophole as I feel this taxi could equally well drop the child and parent in one of the designated parking areas such as the Barn or Civic Hall car park and they could walk to school like other families are doing (unless they have particular reasons why this is not possible such as mobility issues), I think the same consideration could be for a family which I believe has additional needs; as if they parked at Civic Hall it would be possible to walk the child through the park to park gate without the child going near a road. I would invite organisers to review whether the benefits of allowing these particular cars down is worthwhile compared to the risks to children being run over. I was disappointed that the taxi sometimes doesn't enter into the spirit of the concept; they could park further from school to keep the area nearer school free from cars, but instead they often park as near to school as possible, and sometimes turn round using the school kitchen entrance, which is near to where many families are standing waiting to go into school.

(e1) Head of Built Environment and Infrastructure, (Oxford Bus Company)	Thanks for consulting - These do not impinge on bus routes directly and wider TRO measures in place should also avoid any wider impacts from displaced parental traffic and waiting, for example on Abingdon Road in New Hinksey, or on Hollow Way around the signals.  This is an ETRO process and thus any negative impacts that emerge during the trial we will no doubt advise the Council.
(e2) Managing Director, (Oxford Bus Company)	We are supportive of this trial but would be keen to understand what M&E criteria the council will be using to judge whether or not the trial has been a success.  Several of the school street closures adjoin bus routes, such as on the Abingdon Road and Hollow Way, and we are therefore interested to understand whether it is proposed for any assessment / analysis work to be carried out looking at whether the school streets have led to any further congestion / inappropriate parking on bus routes. If you could please confirm what is proposed in this regard, that would be greatly appreciated.
(e3) Local resident, (Oxford, Bedford Street)	I do have one or two questions and a comment.  1. Do you have a definition of who constitutes a 'regular visitor'?  2. Are tradespeople working at a property exempt?  Also, for your information. I live next door but one to the school and every day I observe taxis arriving and parking up to one hour before the end of the school day to collect children and then drive away. I am not convinced all these taxis are collecting special needs children. I assume a taxi collecting a special needs child would drive onto school premises rather than park in Bedford Street? You might need to look for a way of exempting only those taxis delivering or collecting special needs children.

(e4) Local resident, (Oxford)	Thank you for your letter concerning Experimental Traffic Order Sandhills Community Primary School, The plan for parking restrictions on Terret Avenue and nearby streets may well resolve the problem of unwanted parking for residents of that part of Sandhills but, in the absence of additional measures, may only serve to transfer the problem and resurrect an old problem elsewhere on the estate.  Merewood Avenue is the only way on and off the estate and parking restrictions in the form of single yellow lines with time restrictions as well as double yellow have been in place there for many years and served a vital purpose. That is, they have prevented outside commuter drivers and others who wouldn't use the park and ride car park, from leaving their cars on Merewood Avenue, impeding access by emergency and service vehicles and hampering Sandhills commuters driving to and from home.  With your scheme as proposed, parents unable to drop off or pick up their children nearer the school and unwilling to use the park and ride car park and walk their children through the underpass would surely be tempted to park on Merewood Avenue, especially as the existing time restriction doesn't start till 9.00am. This would just re-create all the old problems we thought had long been solved. Similarly, at collection times, some of those same problems could re- emerge.  For your scheme to be viable — and not just move the problem from one part of the estate to another — further parking restrictions would need to be put in place on Merewood Avenue, including moving the morning start time from 9.00 am to 8.00 am and introducing a further restriction band between 2.30 and 3.30 pm. Delbush Avenue, which has an access path to the school half-way down, should also be looked at for introducing further parking restrictions, before this scheme is implemented.  We hope you appreciate our concerns and we look forward to hearing from you.
(e5) Local resident, (Oxford, Burdell Avenue)	I live at the top end of Burdell Avenue and I think the closure of the roads in Sandhills for the primary school are a very good idea.  However I would like to point out that the rest of Sandhills stands to be seriously impacted by the parking restrictions that are in place at the moment, not really being adequate.

	We have already had parents parking across driveways, blocking resident's being able to get out of their own drives and when asked to move their cars, being extremely rude and just walking off stating that they 'need to get their children to school'!  As a resident of Sandhills I would ask that the parking restrictions be increased to 8-10am and also 2-4pm. This would stop parents parking anywhere and everywhere. They should be encouraged to park at the park and ride, for the short time that they would be parking there, and walk their children to school that short distance under the subway to school.
(e6) Local resident, (Oxford)	Just a quick update to let you know how the trial on Barrack's lane is going. All traffic has been displaced to Horspath road - this is where parents drive to in order to drop off their children for school.  I would hope that city planning takes into account all these theories that have been developed in the past, but it seems like it doesn't. Restricting access doesn't stop a behaviour, it simply displaces it.  I do hope that the council will consider other measures such as paying for a school bus and staff it to pick up children every day. This is how you would avoid traffic.
(e7) Local group/organisation, (Cowley Area Transport Group)	We are residents of the Lye Valley estate living in Bulan Road. We cycle in the Hollow Way area frequently, and through Barracks Lane to the Cowley Road and City Centre. Habitually, we try as hard as we can to do so after 9.30am and to complete journeys before 2.30pm to avoid the rush hour-school run on days when this applies. We strongly support a Traffic Filter for Hollow Way and have made a submission to the recent consultation on parking along Hollow Way, which can be seen under Our Consultations at www.catg.org.uk  We strongly support a school street for Barracks Lane in the proximity of the Tyndale School for the following reasons:  1. Conditions with pick up and drop off times at the school are appalling. There is far too much traffic and for those resident in this area it amounts to being 'under siege' at school run times. It is also quite difficult to get through this area as a cyclist at school run times, which is why we strive to avoid it at those times;  2. The traffic conditions on Hollow Way were bad enough before the school was built, which we consider was a mistaken use of this site as it was bound to cause traffic problems. There simply is no space to accommodate the poor driver behaviour (essentially evident impatience) and excessive use of cars from the school run the Tyndale School is generating;

- 3. Given the unhelpful resistance of some people to restraints on their particular school run driving, extra signage and road markings including indications of penalties is essential for the beleaguered community in this area;
- 4. We are amenable to a 'pinch point' at the Barracks Lane-Hollow Way junction to help deter traffic. We also think a level surface in appropriate colours should be installed across this junction as additional protection to all pedestrians (and children) moving in this area;
- 5. We would hope to see a moveable barrier with volunteers to close off Barracks Lane at school opening/closing times. However, we believe that penalties must be emphasised for those who think arriving early in the morning or well before school finishes in some sense 'exempts' them from the 'school street' constraints;
- 6. Housing at the bottom of Barracks Lane before it becomes a pedestrian/cycle route only may need additional measures to prevent drop-offs/pick ups ouside typical school run times;
- 7. We are concerned that some drivers, seeing barriers at Barracks Lane in some form, may drop off or pick up children in the middle of the road even on Hollow Way proximate to a raised pavement of the sort be favour at the top of Barracks Lane. This would be dangerous and enforcement is needed to prevent this sort of behaviour;
- 8. Parents need to receive clear guidance leaflets indicating that there is nowhere for their vehicle to be in Barracks Lane at school run times or earlier or later. The school should be designated as walking/wheeling/cycling access only and it is possible this might require measures to accommodate this. With less vehicles, cycle racks on the road, perhaps installed at an angle, should be considered;
- 9. For parents who do not currently cycle, and particularly for those who have not learned to do so, guidance given should include where training in cycling skills may be obtained for them and their children;
- 10. Our submission on parking changes to Hollow Way includes reference to having a one-way system in the section of Hollow Way between Barracks Lane and the Original Swan junction. Part of the reason for this is the possibility of creating a wider pavement on one side of the road, and a two- way cycle track. We also want Traffic Filter restrictions on Hollow Way to be throughout the day. This is essential to stop attempts to park illegally in Barracks Lane prior to pick up/drop off times.

Whilst I am glad that the School Streets scheme has now started, it has had the predictable outcome of increasing dangerous parking at the Wytham Street/Norreys Avenue junction, as families who previously parked on Vicarage Road have now been displaced to parking in Wytham Street and Norreys Avenue and then walking the short distance through the grounds of St John's church. This is making it more dangerous for the vast majority of families, who walk/scoot/cycle to school along Wytham Street (which is a designated National Cycle Network route). As an example, this morning there were two families parked on the double yellow lines at the Norreys Avenue/Wytham Street junction in large 'people carrier' style vehicles, who were completely obscuring the sight lines for vulnerable road users (eg children cycling or scooting) and therefore making active travel to school more dangerous. They were clearly dropping children at New Hinksey as they had New Hinksey book bags. Children cycling here have to use the main carriageway as there's so much pavement parking that the pavements are generally blocked. As families who park on the double yellow lines here are only stopping for 10 minutes or so, there is little enforcement possible as even if it was reported to the County Council, by the time a Parking Enforcement Officer had arrived, they would have left.

(e8) Local resident, (Oxford, Norreys Avenue) I want to highlight this for two reasons:

- it is important that the adverse effect of the School Streets scheme are included in the evaluation of the scheme and any decision as to whether it should be extended to include Norreys Avenue and the northern section of Wytham Street
- could include in the school newsletter a plea to families who drive to school to be respectful and responsible in where they now park, in particular avoiding parking on the double yellow lines at the Wytham Street/Norreys Avenue junction.

I would, however, feedback that after a further week of the School Streets scheme these interventions are clearly not working.

If you have not done so already, I would invite you to stand at the Norreys Avenue/Wytham Street junction yourself between 8:25 and 8:45 and you will see that there remains a very significant problem of families dropping children off on the double yellow lines at the Norreys Avenue/Wytham Street junction and then reversing round the corner into the paths of other children who are walking/cycling/scooting along the designated cycle route on Wytham Street. This morning I saw three cars parked on the double yellow lines at the corner, and other cars reversing round the corner at the same time (without being able to clearly see where they were reversing), causing significant risk of a serious or fatal accident for other families (the vast majority) who want to safely travel by bike, scooter and walking.

I am seriously concerned that there will be an accident at this location soon, and it seems that whatever interventions the School Streets team have suggested has done little if anything to help. It seems perverse that the outcome of the

School Streets scheme has been to actually discourage active travel to school by making cycling, walking and scooting more dangerous at this location.

I am contacting you again about the extremely dangerous situation at the Norreys Avenue/Wytham Street junction which has been caused by illegal parking as a consequence of displacement of parking from Vicarage Road due to the School Streets scheme.

I am in general an advocate for School Streets schemes, however I think the New Hinksey scheme has been very badly planned as it has moved traffic off a relatively quiet residential road onto the main cycling route on Wytham Street (a designated Sustrans NCN route).

It is now the norm that there are multiple cars parked on the double yellow lines at the Wytham Street/Norreys Avenue restricting visability for pedestrians and cyclists, and often there are cars doing 3-point turns in the junction during school pickup/drop-off.

I cycle with my 6 year old son to/from school daily along Norreys Avenue and Wytham Street and it is becoming increasingly dangerous and I am seriously concerned about the risk of my son having a serious accident at the junction. Just this morning a driver in a 4x4 mounted the curb to park on the corner (on the double yellow lines) at some speed, narrowly missing me and my son. Sadly, this is now not at all unusual.

I have written to you several times about this issue, and each time you say that it is being monitored, but there is no action. It really does feel like the concerns of parents who walk or cycle to school are being completely dismissed. I am calling on you, as both the County Councillor for our ward, and as the Chair of Governors of the school, to take action to prevent a child dying at this junction. This might include extending the School Streets scheme to include Norreys Avenue and Wytham Street, or having ANPR/CCTV monitoring of the junction with drivers who park illegally on the double yellow lines being fined. I really don't think the current situation can be allowed to continue.

## (e9) Local resident, (Oxford, Vicarage Road)

I am writing to provide my strong support for the school streets scheme, I think it will make a huge difference to Vicarage Road and the safety of everyone during the school pickup and dropoff periods.

One question, could you clarify if Car Club vehicles will be exempt? In the area, we have several including one that 'lives' in the enforcement area. It would probably make sense for all car club vehicles to be exempt as they will most likely be used by residents.

(e10) Local resident, (Oxford, Wytham Street)	I support the idea of encouraging children to walk and cycle to school. However, the New Hinksey school street has had some negative side effects. I live on the north end of Wytham Street and the impact of the school street has been to push traffic onto Wytham Street, with parents using the cut through by the church to get to school. This has resulted in dangerous / illegal parking, including on double yellow lines. As lots of children walk or cycle up Wytham Street to school, it also creates a new traffic bottleneck they need to negotiate. I have pictures of this which I can share with the council. If the scheme is to continue, it should include Wytham Street. Please note that this feedback was given when the scheme was first introduced but ignored. I haven't seen anyone from the council monitoring traffic on Wytham Street but this should be done. If Wytham Street is excluded from the scheme, we should be provided with a clear rationale for this decision.
(e11) Local resident, (Oxford, Summerfield)	It is essential that the list of exemptions should include casual visitors, including tradesmen, to dwellings in the area. It would be unacceptable if, when you finally get a plumber, he has to wait an hour before he can get to your house. I realise that this is less easy to administer than exemptions for people who can be recognised in advance, but it is very important. Perhaps an on-line system would allow details to be supplied on the day. But by hook or by crook a solution must be found.
(e12) Local resident, (Oxford, Wytham Street)	Thank you for your letter notifying us the proposals for traffic orders in the vicinity of New Hinksey Primary School. We think that the reasons offered for doing the trial are good, so we support the trial in principle. However, there are two points that we would like to raise.  1) We live at the north end of Wytham St but park our car in the grounds of St John's Church (for a fee that we pay to the church), access to which is via Vicarage Road. Since our car is registered to Wytham St and we are not resident in an exempted street, on the current proposals it appears that we would be fined, and quickly lose our licences, were we to drive down Vicarage Road when it is closed. Would we be able to obtain an exemption from Penalty Charge Notices? If not, from our point of view, the proposals should be rejected.  2) The north end of Wytham St is a cul-de-sac on a very well-used, designated cycle and pedestrian route into central Oxford, it also offers pedestrian and cycle access (of about 100m) to the school. As the proposal stands, there is nothing to prevent school-related traffic from using any of the roads from Norreys Avenue to Oswestry Road to gain access to the top of Wytham St. It is not difficult to imagine the congestion that this could cause, or the hazards that would be presented to anyone in the vicnity of the cycle/foot path or of the gate through the church yard to the school.

	For this reason, it appears that the proposal would not only not achieve its desired ends but could be counter-productive by causing additional hazards to the very people the proposal is designed to protect.
(e13) Didcot Town Council	Didcot Town Council's Planning and Development Committee has requested that when the temporary scheme is concluded and due for a review, the Town Council should be informed and invited to participate in any discussions or consultations, as the scheme may have an impact on the Council Offices and the Didcot Civic Hall.
(e14) Local resident, (Didcot, Manor Road)	On Manor Road at the junction with Foxhall Road. Parents clearly parking on double yellow lines collecting children from the school. I've raised this previously with the headteacher on behalf of residents of Manor Road.  Can consideration be made about extending the scheme into manor road before this illegal parking causes a fatal accident.
