The Biodiversity Action Framework and Action Plan have been produced to fulfil the Council's obligations to conserve and enhance biodiversity under the strengthened biodiversity duty introduced by the Environment Act 2021.

The Biodiversity Action Framework and Action plan introduces a wide range of policies and associated actions to support the Council in conserving and enhancing biodiversity. This fulfils a legal requirement under the Environment Act 2021, but also supports the Oxfordshire Environmental Principles and delivery of a range of the Council's Corporate Priorities. The policies and actions have been developed through internal consultation with Council staff.

The report was presented to and discussed at Directorate Leadership Team meetings in early 2024 as a first step in informing development of the Biodiversity Action Framework and Action Plan.

Throughout 2024 and 2025 ongoing dialogue with relevant teams and data gathering (see <u>Biodiversity Action Report 2024</u>) has refined the potential actions identified in the Initial Considerations report to inform development of the Framework and Action Plan. Drafts of the documents were consulted on internally through a Let's Talk survey and direct discussions with relevant teams between April and July 2025.
