OXFORD TO CAVERSHAM: A4074 CORRIDOR - PROPOSED 40MPH & 50MPH SPEED LIMITS (ADMINISTRATIVE AMENDMENT)

RECOMMENDATION

The Cabinet Member is RECOMMENDED to:

- (a) Approve the introduction of the following 50mph speed limit, as advertised:
 - (i) A4074 (Berinsfield to Shillingford).

Executive Summary

- 1. Due to an administrative error, one section of the A4074 (Berinsfield to Shillingford) was omitted from the recommendation contained within the report that was presented to, and approved at, the Delegated Decisions by Cabinet Member for Transport Management Meeting on 09th October 2025.
- 2. The Berinsfield to Shillingford section, otherwise known as the Dorchester Bypass, was proposed to have a reduction of the speed limit from National Speed Limit to 50mph, as shown in **Annex 1**.
- 3. Details of the consultation, responses and officer responses to objections and concerns relevant to all highway sections, including Berinsfield to Shillingford, were presented in the report on 9th October. Therefore, these matters are not included in this current amendment report, which is intended to formally obtain an approval as this section does not appear in the published Decisions list.

Corporate Policies and Priorities

- 4. Of the nine priorities identified within the 'Oxfordshire Strategic Plan 2022-2025', the proposals support priority no.3 by reducing the risk to road users, with the nine priorities listed below:
 - (1) Put action to address the climate emergency at the heart of our work.
 - (2) Tackle inequalities in Oxfordshire.
 - (3) Prioritise the health and wellbeing of residents.

- (4) Support carers and the social care system.
- (5) Invest in an inclusive, integrated and sustainable transport network.
- (6) Preserve and improve access to nature and green spaces.
- (7) Create opportunities for children and young people to reach their full potential.
- (8) Play our part in a vibrant and participatory local democracy.
- (9) Work with local businesses and partners for environmental, economic and social benefit.

5. Funding for consultation on the proposals (and implementation if approved) has been provided by the County Council's Vision Zero programme.

- 6. The consultation that has been undertaken complies with the consultation requirements for the various elements as required by law including under the Highways Act 1980, the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 and any other relevant legislation.
- 7. The scheme has been promoted by Oxfordshire County Council as the Highway Authority and Traffic Authority under the Highways Act 1980, and the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.
